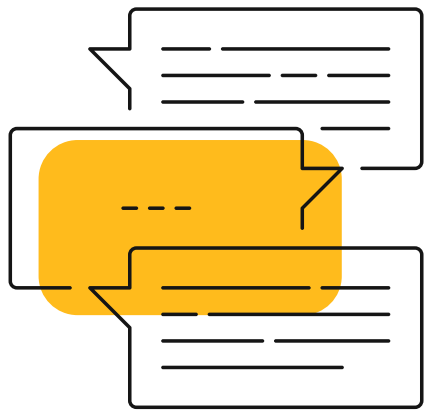

## UX designer

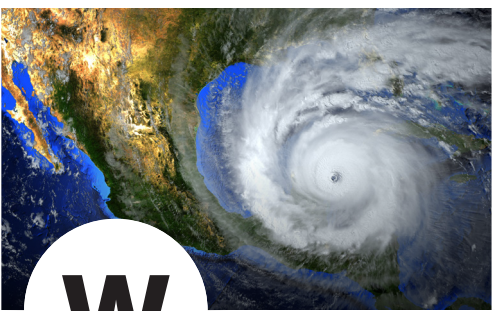
UX (or user experience) designers find themselves consulting with international colleagues, clients and partners in a global marketplace.

## X ray operator

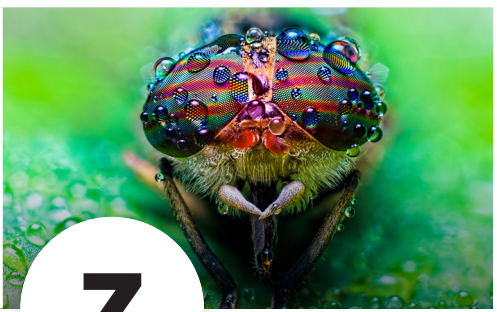
Clear communication is key in hospitals and surgeries, knowing different languages can be extremely helpful.
