What do young people in college today think about the resit process for English and maths?

We asked 1,000 college students to give their perspectives including almost 600 who've had to, or will have to, take at least one resit themselves.

What students think of English



64% of college students say GCSE English helps prepare students with the skills they need for further study and the workplace ■ 1in 7 (14%) disagree.


The **top reasons** students value English:

- It helps them express thoughts and opinions clearly (36%).
- They enjoy reading or writing (35%).
- and write for the workplace (35%).

Just **3.5%** see **no value** in studying English.
