Now, I know a lot of people have a lot of objections to using AI in education, learning for all sorts of reasons, and you're right. If you use AI to teleport to an answer, then you impede learning, and you actually deplete the learning prowess, the neuroplasticity that is required. However, if you use AI to help map out thousands of learning objectives and really understand where a person is on their learning objective journey and identify the best personalized pathway for a person, given their skills, their knowledge, their interests, their motivations, then we can demonstrate that you can have higher efficacy and much better outcomes in the future. And so I think that's something that educators can absolutely lead with, and that way, you can help humans work with AI to be much more successful and to get more done.
