Jenna: Oh, no! I'm too busy! I go to work at the studio at 6:00 A.M. A makeup artist puts on my makeup from 6:00 to 6:30. Then it's work, work, work! When I have free time at work, I study my lines and I exercise. After work, I visit friends and go out for dinner. I come home very late. After I come home, I read or listen to music.

AH: So, who does your laundry?

Jenna: My husband does. He does it twice or three times a week. And he does a very good job!
