## Enhancing communication skills using Big English with MyEnglishLab

Young Learners

### THE CHALLENGE

In September of 2014, teachers at a primary school in Spain came together with the goal of enhancing their students' English communication skills. Their focus was to develop strong student achievement in pronunciation, grammatical structure and vocabulary.

In order to achieve this goal they wanted to find materials that related to students' real life experiences, as well as support correct pronunciation and grammar. They believed this would engage and motivate their students.

### THE SOLUTION

To achieve this goal, teachers started using Big English in all primary classes (grades 1-6) starting in 2014. Grades 1-4 used the Big English Student Book and Workbook, while grades 5 and 6 used MyEnglishLab (online practice). The teachers also used the Active Teach platform (presentation tool).

There were 60 students per grade and Big English materials were supplemented with materials developed by the teachers.

Overview of how Big English with MyEnglishLab was used:

Grades 3 and 4

- 3 hours of English per week (2 sessions/90 minutes each session).
- 1 hour each week was dedicated to work on a long-term project to be completed in English.
- Project topics included science, social life, energy and ecosystems.
- The Big English workbook was used for practice activities.
- Teachers graded students daily.
- The final grade was given at the end of the year based on the accumulation of daily work, tests and projects.

Overview of Grades 5 and 6

- 5 hours of English per week.
- 1 hour each week was dedicated to work on a long-term project to be completed in English.
- Project topics included climate and landscapes, classification of animals in grade 5 and stages of life in grade 6.
- My EnglishLab was used for homework, as well as summative assessments based on tests.
- Teachers graded students daily.
- The final grade was given at the end of the year based on daily work, projects and MyEnglishLab.
- MyEnglishLab made up 20% of a student's total grade.
