

This resource has been designed for test-takers and teachers to view examples of International Certificate item types and gain some useful tips to aid preparation.


The information can be used to help develop useful strategies for test day.

Speaking and Reading Read Aloud



What is being asked?

This question asks the learner to read aloud a sentence or short text.

What is being tested?

This question tests accurate pronunciation and how fluent the learner is at speaking. It tests if the words in the text are understood and repeated accurately.

What is being asked?

This question asks the learner to read aloud a sentence or short text.

What is being tested?

This question tests accurate pronunciation and how fluent the learner is at speaking. It tests if the words in the text are understood and repeated accurately.



Read aloud tips

- Use the 40 seconds to skim and understand the topic.
- Break the text into chunks and pause slightly between each one as you read.
- When reading, stress the words that carry important information, this makes it easier to understand what you are saying.
- Use rising intonation patterns to show a contrast, and falling to show you have finished a point.



Speaking Describe the image

Look at the picture. You have 25 seconds to prepare. After the beep, speak into the microphone and describe the picture. You have 25/40 seconds to give your response.



Recorded Answer

Current Status: Beginning in 22 seconds.

What is being asked?

This question asks the learner to look at a photograph or picture and describe what they see.

What is being tested?

This question tests the learner's ability to speak in an extended way linking concepts and ideas. It tests the accuracy of speech including accurate grammar, pronunciation and stress as well as the fluency of the speech.


Describe the image tips

- You have 25 seconds before the microphone opens to look carefully at the image.
- Think of any implications or conclusions that can be drawn.
- Make notes of the main points and decide the order in which you will describe the information.
- After the tone, start with a general statement of what the image is about, then describe the details.






Listen and repeat tips

- Listen to the way the speaker groups words into meaningful phrases.
- Listen for the speaker's intonation and aim to copy it.
- Note how the speaker uses word stress to highlight important information and try to do the same.
- Don't try to copy the accent, just speak naturally, being mindful of pace and volume.




Passage Comprehension: Choose the Right Picture tips

- Keep your eyes hovering over the pictures when listening to the question, noticing any key differences.












Listen and read tips

- Use the 10 seconds before the recording begins to skim the transcript and familiarise yourself with the topic.
- Move your cursor to the start of the transcript to get ready, then follow each word to the pace of the speaker's voice, being careful to keep up.
- Think how each word you are reading will sound and as soon as you hear a different word, click on the incorrect word.

Listening and writing tips

- When the audio begins, focus on the meaning of the sentence. This will help you to remember it.
- Write or type the content words, leave minor words (prepositions, articles) for now.
- Write or type as quickly as you can, don't worry about spelling at this point.
- After the recording stops, go over the sentence and check your knowledge of grammar to add any words you missed out.





This question tests the holistic understanding of short messages, notes and short pieces of writing.



Choose the right picture tips

- Read the question first, this will tell you what information you are looking for in the pictures.
- Pay attention to key words in the text and the question asked.
- Remember key vocabulary items should be visible in the correct picture. This will help you to eliminate those that do not contain the specified items or that contain items that have not been mentioned.



Reading Short answer questions

Read the information from a website below and answer the questions. Use no more than three words for each answer.

Achoo! The Oxgate Research Centre needs you!

Do you suffer from hay fever? Whether you have severe or mild symptoms, the Oxgate Research Centre is looking for your help with their medical research. The researchers are using social sensing, a new investigative technique through which large data sets are collected by asking people to track their own behaviours and input information into a mobile phone app. After downloading the app, you will be asked to press a button every time you sneeze. Over time, it is also possible that the app might be able to recognise the sound of your sneeze. Using location data sent through the app, researchers will then be able to detect the presence of pollen in particular areas. Participants in the research project will only be contributing to important research, but will also be able to avoid irritation by using the app to see where others have been experiencing symptoms.

Short answer questions tips

- Skim the text quickly to understand the topic first.
- Focus on key words in the questions and use these to scan the text for details.
- Write only the word/s that answer the question and use content from the text where appropriate, this will ensure your responses are brief and accurate.



Choose the right word or phrase tips

- First read the gapped text first and decide it's purpose.
 This can help to eliminate wrong options in terms of tone, grammar and meaning.
- Note key words in the text, this will help to understand the main message.
- Look at the words either side of the gap and use knowledge of grammar and vocabulary to predict the type of word or phrase that is missing.




Read and then write tips

- In the 30 seconds before the text disappears, read the passage calmly. First skim for general topic, then read carefully for main ideas.
- Aim to develop your own techniques for rapid notetaking so they become automatic.
- Remember best responses will clearly summarize the main idea and condense essential supporting ideas.
- Check grammar before submitting your response.



Short writing task Describe image



What is being asked?

This question asks the learner to write a short essay in response to a prompt. For lower levels, test takers need to write a short description of an image.

What is being tested?

This question tests writing skills. It tests paragraph and sentence structure, the range and accuracy of the language used, the ability to structure an argument or discussion in a written context. It tests grammar and vocabulary as an essential part of writing.




Short writing task (Describe image) tips

- Look carefully at the image. Spend the first few minutes planning: what is happening in the image, what tense/s are required.
- Consider the vocabulary needed and make sure you know enough words to write your answer.
- Start with a general statement of what the image is about, then describe the details.
- Write at least 25 words.



Short writing task Write essay



What is being asked?

This question asks the learner to write a short essay in response to a prompt. For lower levels, test takers need to write a short description of an image.

What is being tested?

This question tests writing skills. It tests paragraph and sentence structure, the range and accuracy of the language used, the ability to structure an argument or discussion in a written context. It tests grammar and vocabulary as an essential part of writing.



Short writing task (Write essay) tips

- Read the prompt carefully and highlight all the content points to be covered. Use these to build the content of the response and organize your answer.
- Use the prompt to decide what type of text you need to write in terms of form and tone; the essay might agree or disagree with the prompt, persuade etc
- Use linkers and discourse markers to help your writing flow: e.g. after that, however, on the other hand.
- Check your work at the end for spelling and punctuation errors
