

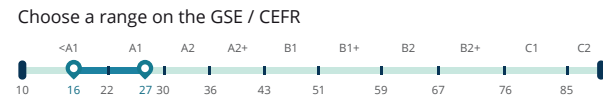


GSE Teacher Toolkit - Secondary Teachers Journey

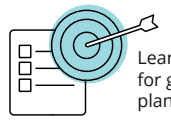

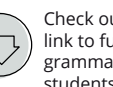
