



Teaching Notes

- To help the children visualize the idea of what a picnic is about, show them one copy of page one of this worksheet (Note: You will give them each a copy of their own later.)
- Say: *These friends are having a picnic! They are at the park. They eat food at the park. They sit at a picnic table or they sit on a blanket. Then, they eat and drink. Then, they play games in the park. They like picnics!*
- Say: What can you eat at a picnic?
- Then, show flashcards, one at a time, saying what each is with this pattern: *This is a (sandwich/cookie/pizza/ banana, etc.). This is (lemonade/milk/water).*
- Ask students what else they can eat on a picnic. Listen to all the food and drinks they know.
- Last, show them the flashcard of a napkin. Explain that they use this to clean their hands and mouth after they eat.
- Now, give each child one copy of page one of the **warm-up worksheet**.
- Describe and pantomime the things and actions they see in the picture.
- If time allows, let students color in the worksheet. (Note: In doing so, you can review colors and objects by giving commands: *Color the table red; Color the dog brown; etc.*)
