

In 2015, to tackle the issue, *Pearson* and *Save the Children* formed a strategic partnership which leverages both organizations' assets, networks and expertise.

- Help to improve learning outcomes, skills and progression rates.
- Strengthen the ability of education systems to cope with the influx of school-aged children.

## Value of the Collaboration

To date, *Pearson* has committed £4.5 million (US\$5.93M) for the activities in the *Every Child Learning Partnership*.

Enabling the establishment of two education centers in Amman, in communities with a high refugee population and great need, as well as advocacy around improving access to education in emergencies.

At the end of 2016, *Pearson* committed to doubling their investment for an additional three years, to support the pilot of new programmatic and digital solutions, in partnership with the Jordanian Ministry of Education.
