

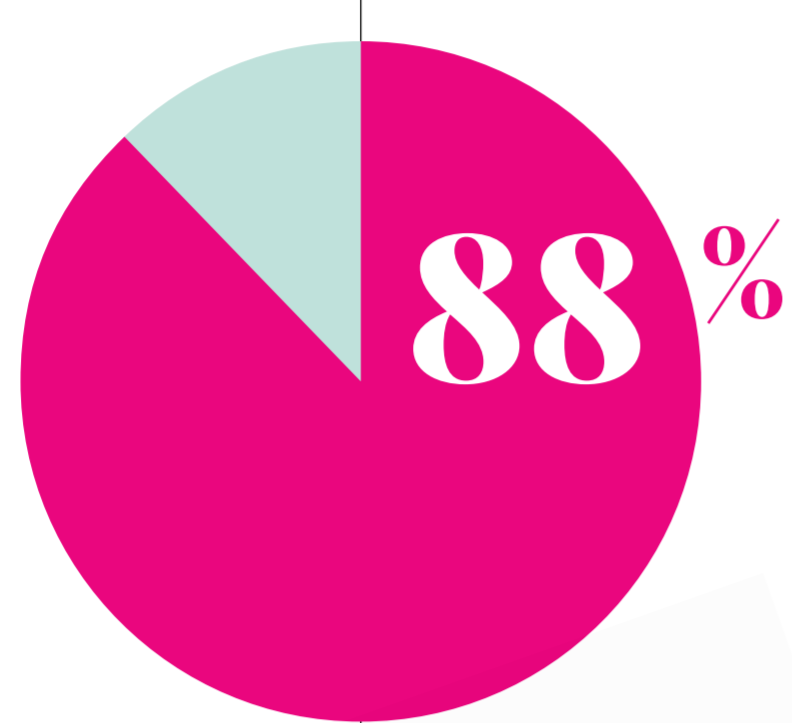
Covid-19: Education's Revolution

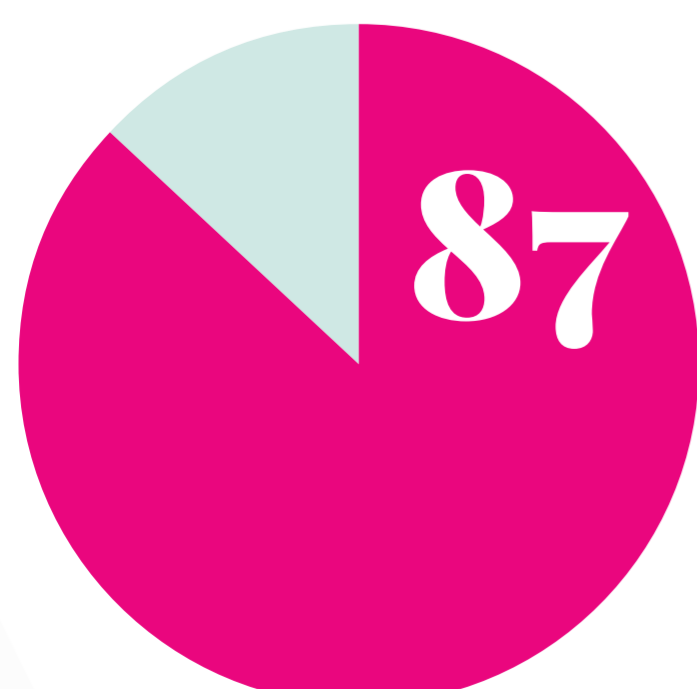

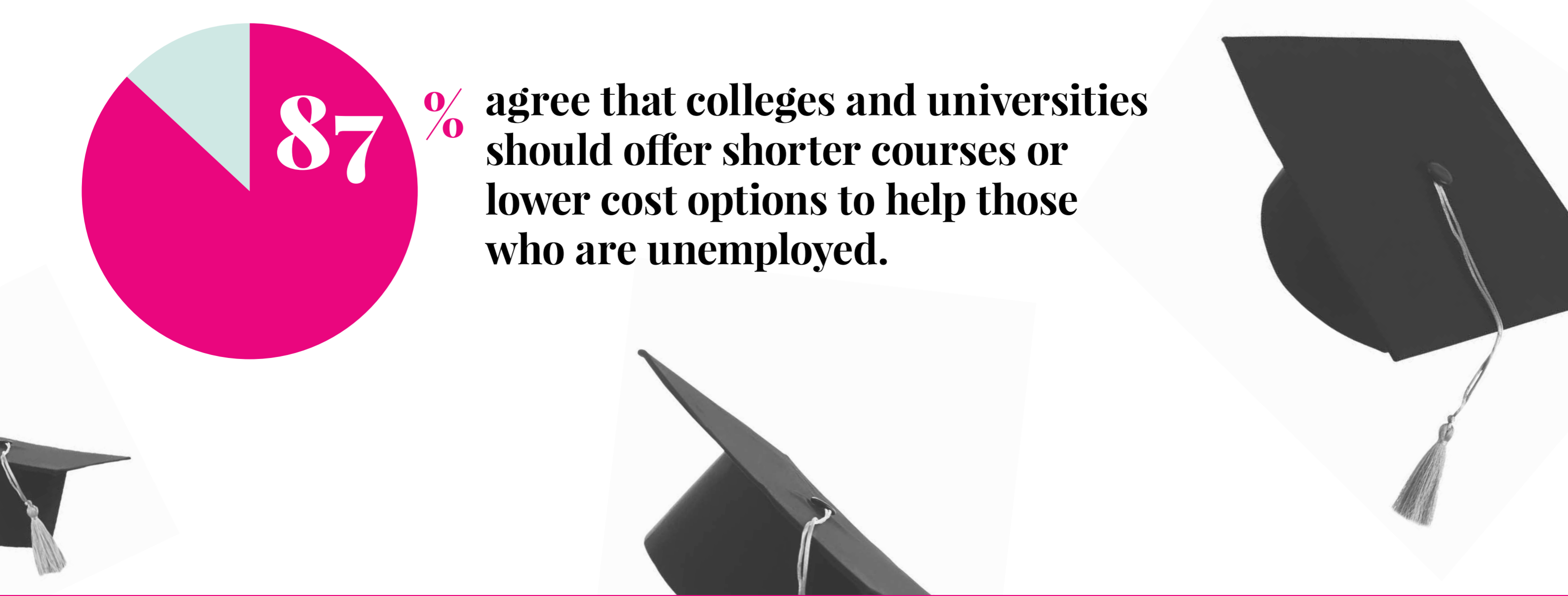
