

Each term expresses gender bias in some way. Some terms do this more obviously than others, for example, freshman. For other terms, it may not be as easy to identify bias immediately, especially for learners whose first language is not English:

Armstrong's use of man would also be gender biased. However, experts suggest that he actually said a man, referring specifically to himself, and that the original audio recording was ambiguous.

A maiden is an unmarried woman, and in this context is used to mean first time, making it gender biased and also inappropriate. However, this word is in everyday use in this context.

'Must hold a passport from one of the following countries: UK, USA, Australia, New Zealand, Canada, Republic of Ireland.' This is discrimination based on country of origin or citizenship.

The mention of 'no... disabilities' makes this discriminatory.

'All applicants must include a recent photo in their application.'

This is discrimination. It is possible that the photo may be used to directly or indirectly discriminate based on some aspect of appearance (e.g. skin colour).
