## Apply through an agent

All prospective students who choose to use an agent must use an official Monash University agent. Monash agents are carefully assessed, monitored and reviewed to ensure only reputable and experienced agents can represent our institution.

Monash agents have expert knowledge of the University and our courses. They can generally help you with all (or most) courses offered by Monash University, Monash College and the Monash University English Language Centre.

An education agent can assist you with your university application and visa arrangements. They understand the university system in Australia, and can help you:

- work out which course is best for you
- understand our entry requirements
- apply to Monash
- organise the documents you'll need
- arrange your visa.

All Monash undergraduate courses require you to have successfully completed a minimum of an Australian Year 12 qualification (or equivalent) and achieve the required academic entry score. Most Monash faculties generally use your most recent studies for admission however other guidelines may apply where your prior qualification may be considered.

# Entry requirements (e.g. B. Commerce)

## How to calculate your entry score

### GCE A Levels

Total score by achieving either:

- A maximum of the best 3 A Level subjects completed within two years<sup>^</sup>. In the event where only 1 A Level subject has been completed (and no other A Level subjects have been completed), 2 AS Level subjects can be counted in place of 1 A Level subject however the AS Level subject must not be in the same subject area as the A Level subjects included in the calculation.  
OR
- A minimum of the best 2 A Level subjects completed within two years<sup>^</sup> plus the best 2 AS Level subjects. The AS Level subjects however must not be in the same subject area as the A Level subjects included in the calculation.

<sup>^</sup>Subjects completed within two years may include more than one sitting. For example, subjects completed in June 2019 until June 2021 are acceptable.

Additional guidelines:

- Score grades as follows:
  - A Level subjects: A\*(a\*) = 5, A(a) = 4, B(b) = 3, C(c) = 2, D(d) = 1, E(e) = 0, U = 0.
  - AS Level subjects: a(a) = 2.5, b(b) = 2, c(c) = 1.5, d(d) = 1, e(e) = 0.5, U = 0.
- N (Narrow failure) & U (Unclassified) results are not to be included in the calculation.
- A maximum of 1 bonus point is offered when achieving A\* in an A Level Subject.

# Study grants

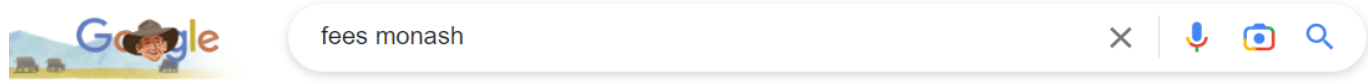
- Automatically assessed upon receiving the student's application
- Limited number
- Study Grants are offered at either \$5,000 AUD or \$10,000 AUD (depending on the outcome of your assessment).
- Given to a conditional or full offer letter to study at a Monash Australia campus.
- Depending on the offer amount, this is paid in either one or two payments of \$5,000 AUD per semester (and the value is credited against the tuition fees).
- Must study a minimum 12 credit point load per semester to maintain the grant
- Not available for TNE or sponsored students
- Not applicable to all courses



# Acceptance – the essentials

- All fields in Part A of the offer letter must be filled properly, NO MISSING PAGES
- Part A of the offer must be signed by the student (as well as parent/guardian for U18) – no proxy
- Signature on hard copy offer must be the same with the one provided earlier (e.g. on passport, on forms, etc.)
- Signature on hard copy offer must not be a cut and paste from another form (it must be handwritten)
- Send acceptance to Email: [mu.documents@monash.edu](mailto:mu.documents@monash.edu) or through the agent (if applicable)
- Endeavour not to leave it too late (it may takes time to get the visa)

## Pay your fees

When fees are due, you'll receive a document advising you of the amount and due date. This will be in the form of one of the following:

- fees statement (also available in the [Web Enrolment System](#))
- application form
- International Student Course Agreement.

## Scam warning

To protect yourself from fraudsters and scams, pay using only the methods below and never pay through a third party, even if discounts are offered.

Scammers may contact you on social media, or be recommended by a friend. The scammer makes payments to the University using stolen credit cards and shows you the payment is accepted. Weeks or months later, payments are reversed and your course fees remain unpaid. Victims lose the money they paid to the scammer and still have to pay the University in full.

## Payment methods and transfer times

Monash University does not accept payment using prepaid gift cards and/or prepaid debit/credit cards. # Acceptance – the essentials

## Non-government sponsored students:

- Signed Part A of the offer letter; and
- Submit it along with payments & copy of passport.

## Government sponsored students:

- Signed Part A of the offer letter; and
- Submit it along with copy of Financial Guarantee and copy of passport. (The Financial Guarantee must have the student's details and the course the student is sponsored for, which matches the offer letter)

COE (Confirmation of Enrolment) will be granted upon receiving all the required documents. COE is to be used to apply for a student visa. **MUST check dates on COE**

# Acceptance – the essentials

For U18:

- U18 form must be completed properly
- Accommodation confirmation must be submitted along with the U18 form
- The parent who signed the U18 form must provide copy of their photo identification with their signature (and the signature on the U18 form must match with the one on the ID)
- If both parents sign different forms, e.g. father signed the application form, father signed Part A of the offer, mother signed the U18 form, we only need the mother's photo identification with her signature



# Acceptance - Under 18

Important note:

Students who are under 18 when lodging their offer acceptance, but will be over 18 when arriving at Monash for enrolment, have the option of not applying for U18 care giver or accommodation. Instead, they are to sign the Statement of Intention form stating that they will not arrive in Australia until they turn 18. The form will be provided to them when Admissions processes the acceptance.

# Acceptance – Quota Courses

To secure a place for a quota course:

**apply and accept early**

Places in quota courses are allocated on a first come first serve basis

Should the places be filled by the time the acceptance & the required documents are received, the offer has to be deferred to the next available intake

Application & acceptance closing date are varied across courses

# Documentation Audit

Monash may contact student to request certified or original academic documents.

In order to be ready in the event their application is audited, students must ensure they have all their **original** or **certified** copies of their supporting academic documents with them when they arrive in Australia.

**Fraudulent document** will result to cancelation of offer & enrolment. Monash will report the case to the case to Australian Government agencies and will not release the student to other institution.



# Online enrolment

After accepting Monash offer, students can enroll online up to 3 to 5 months prior to course commencement date. This will allow them to familiarize themselves with the unit outline and outcomes, and the type of assessments they'll undertake.

## **Conditional offer:**

If the acceptance is still conditional, the student will not be able to enroll until they meet their condition(s).

## **Awaiting for credit assessment:**

Students can enroll while waiting for the outcome of their credit assessment. They will have the chance to change units later.

**Once they've enrolled, they may order their Monash ID card**

# Changing mind – what to do

For newly enrolled student

## **Change of course:**

- Must be done before census date
- Have to lodge the request to change course
- Subject to course availability and meeting the requirements

## **Change intake:**

- Have to lodge the request to defer
- Subject to course availability and meeting the requirements
- Have to return home or enrol in another course during the gap
- Refer to refund policy for information on refund, please note the refund request date matters

# Changing mind – what to do

## Newly enrolled wanting to transfer to another institution:

- Have to lodge the request to be released
- Subject to University's approval
- Refer to [Standard 7 National Code](#) & Monash [International Student Transfer between Registered Providers Policy](#) for policy guideline
- Approved release request: student's COE(s) will be cancelled, they may transfer to the other institution
- Rejected release request: the student is either continue studying or return home.

**Enrolled student wanting to transfer to another institution** before completing 6 months of the principle course: their academic track record (at the College), attendance & behavior will determine the assessment outcome.
