What's in it?

If it doesn't, use *ie*, as in *believe* and *achieve*.
There are some exceptions to this rule, like *protein*, *caffeine* and *seize*, which have to be learnt.

Models for Lighting a Bulb in a Circuit

Here are two common models used to explain how the bulb is lit.

Model 1: Rope loop model

Look closely at this diagram. It shows children modelling how a bulb is lit in a circuit. This is the rope loop model. Nadia's instructions about how to model this are not very clear:

"The hands holding the string are open so the string can move through them. One person closes their hand a little and another person pulls the string. The hands of the person holding the string more closely feels their hands warm up."

This model is like the ball pass model, but instead of passing a ball you put three or four raisins in small cups. People stand in a circle passing the cups of raisins around the circle when signalled to do so.

One person acts as the bulb and eats a raisin from each cup when it reaches them. The bulb is lit when the cup has raisins to offer.
