## 2.2 this, that, these, those

With there is / there are, before plural and uncountable nouns, we use:

- some in affirmative sentences.
- any in negative sentences and questions.

This is a blue T-shirt. This T-shirt is blue.
These are Jenny's jeans.
These jeans are Jenny's. That is my dad's coat. That coat is my dad's.
Those are new shoes. Those shoes are new.

Use this/these to talk about someone or something that is near.

Use that/those to talk about someone or something that is further away.

This/That = singular. These/Those = plural.
When we say that something is here, it is near us. When we say that something is there or over there, it is away from us.
