


Basketball Quiz

Levels (CEFR)	A1 +
Age	8+
Time	12 minutes
Materials	Basketball cut out Questions

Preparation

Draw a simple basketball court on the board like the one below. Cut out a card basketball shape and attach an adhesive.

Prepare a set of questions you want students to answer. This game works well as a review by preparing questions about what students have learned during a unit of work.



How to play

- Divide the class into two teams. Each team nominates a spokesperson, who will answer the questions. Then have them toss a coin to decide which team will go first. Assign teams to either side of the court.
- Ask a question, and allow students a few seconds to discuss the answer in their team. If they answer correctly, they get to answer another question (maximum 3 questions in a row). When they have answered **three** questions correctly, they score two points. Keep a tally of the points scored by each team.

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- Move the basketball closer to the hoop each time the team answers a question correctly. If they answer incorrectly, the ball changes possession and the other team can attempt to answer.
- After points have been scored, it is the other team's turn.
- When all the questions have been answered (or you decide it is time to end the game), tally up the points. The team with the most points wins.

Tip

Divide play into four three-minute quarters. Use a timer and stop play after three minutes. Then ask a question and have both teams try to answer. The first team to answer correctly gains possession.
