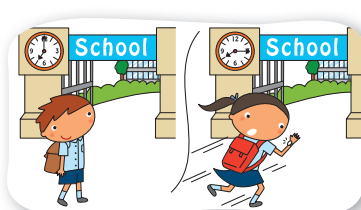

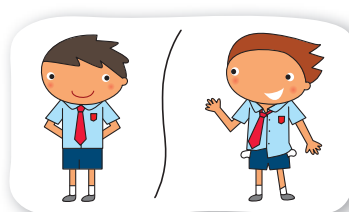

What are the differences between Chinese and Western dining customs?

Eating / Sharing food

Chinese

Everyone shares the dishes on the table. People don't start eating until their elders say 'Let's eat!'



Western

Everyone has their own plate of food. There may also be some food on the table for sharing.

Can you pass me the salad, please?



Here you go.

Using tableware

Chinese

People hold their chopsticks with one hand and the bowl with another.



Playing with chopsticks or sticking them into your rice bowl is very rude.

Western

People hold their knife in one hand and their fork in the other.



It is bad manners to point with your knife or fork or put your elbows on the table.
