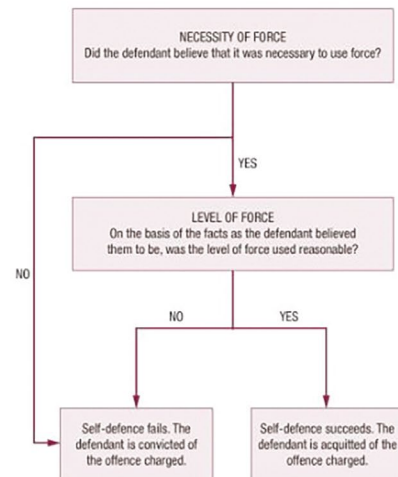

There is a tension between the emphasis on the defendant's interpretation of events in relation to the necessity to resort to force and the objective evaluation of the level of force. However, an objective element is a necessary safeguard against the use of excessive force in society.

Problem scenario

Following a General Election, the Yellow Party has won the most seats, but slightly less than enough seats to form a majority. The Purple Party, who have similar views on many issues, won a few Members of Parliament (MPs). Together, the Yellow Party and the Purple Party would be able to form a majority. - Abolishing the Scottish Parliament
- The limitation of the powers of the Supreme Court.
