# How do Pearson resources align to the EEF tiered approach?



In June, the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) published their [Guide to Supporting School Planning: A Tiered Approach to 2020-21](#), a support guide with practical, evidence-based guidance to help schools navigate the busy and unpredictable year ahead, and help direct their catch-up premium for the 2020-21 in the most effective way.



## Key highlights

The **EEF Guide to Supporting School Planning** aims to support school leaders with their planning for the academic year 2020-21. It proposes a tiered model that focuses on:

- ✦ High quality teaching, including blended learning, high quality assessments, planning for remote teaching and learning, and professional development
- ✦ Targeted academic support, which includes structured (one to one and small group) interventions, effective use of teaching assistants, tutoring and re-establishing routines
- ✦ Wider strategies to aid school leaders' existing school improvement planning efforts, including attendance, behaviour and social and emotional support, and effective communication with parents and care givers

The EEF recommends that a tiered approach can offer a useful framework for thinking about how to balance different challenges created by whole school returns, as well as helping to focus on a small number of strategies that will have the biggest difference.
