
## Unlocking Cultures The importance of language learning

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Tell us about some of the ways you or your family preserve(s) your culture?




"Language, food, songs, dances, traditions, rites of passage, get-togethers."

have unhindered communication with people who may not speak English completely fluently.


We can appreciate jokes together that are only relevant in our language, describe things that do not have a translation into English and support our children in learning the language. It connects us.
