I'm going to show you today how to access your books online completely free. That way if you either left your books at campus or you were using a library copy of a book or something, and you are stressed that you now have to go buy a book, I have an option for you so that you can have a free book for the rest of the semester. So, you're going to go to your browser, and you'll type in RedShelf Respond. And then go to student.response.redshelf.com. If you just go to RedShelf, it doesn't register that you get free books. It'll still make you pay for the books full price. So really make sure that you're going to this. And you get up to 7 free eBooks. So, you'll go over here, hit log in. If you don't have an account, you'll go to create an account. You'll type in all this information and then you'll search for your school.

If you can't find your school, it might be because they don't have a license with RedShelf. In that case, you wouldn't be able to use this, but you might be able to use VitalSource. And then you will click, you read all of the terms of use and privacy notice. And then create your account. I'm going to go back and go ahead and just log in. So, you can see I actually have used this. I got one of my textbooks that I had to give back to the university but what you'll do is you'll go up here to search and if you -- you just type in the title. If you know the ISBN number, you can type in that. I'm just going to type in physics and hit search. And then I'm going to go to this one and you can see that it says borrow through 5/25. If you did it correctly, they'll come up like this. If you didn't do it correctly, it'll actually come up with a price that you have to pay. So, it's really, really important that you actually go to student.response.redshelf.com. You'll just hit view details.

And then it'll tell you to activate your account. You will do the email. You'll activate that and then it'll actually add the book to your library. And then just to access your library, I guess, it calls it my shelf. You'll go here and then it will have the book that you borrowed. And then you have 38 day rental duration and then you just hit start reading. And it will -- there we go. It will bring your book up. So, you can just read your book just like you had it initially.
