

# Go Digital with Your Pearson Textbook

Here's how to find a digital copy of your Pearson text. We'll also take a look at how find and download online resources to help you teach with your Pearson title.

First, let's find a digital copy of your text.

Start by opening your browser and going to Pearson's online catalog at the following link. Feel free to hit pause on this video, if you need more time to view the link.

Next, use the search field to search our catalog for your Pearson text. You can search by title, author, or ISBN.

Scroll through the search results to find your text. Once you've located your text, select the title to continue.

Now you'll see information specific to your book. Scroll down and select Preview this title online to request access to a digital copy of your text. A new tab will open in your browser, and you'll be taken to one of Pearson's partners to complete your request.

You may have the option to choose either a PDF version or an EPUB version of your text. Not sure which to choose or what this means? PDFs are generally easier to use, so we recommend PDF.

Next, select Request Sample... and complete the steps to request your digital copy. Note you may have to sign in or create an account to complete your request.

Now let's take a look at how to find and download online resources for your Pearson text.

Start by going back to Pearson's online catalog. Again, here's the link. Feel free to press pause on the video, if you need more time to view the link.

You can again search for your text using the search field. Choose your text from the search results by selecting the title of your text.

Now we're back to viewing information specific to your text. Select Download instructor resources to view the resources available for your title. Note that you may need to scroll down to view the full list.

The resources available will vary depending on the Pearson title you're using. Once you've found a resource you would like to download, select the download link.

Next, verify you're an instructor by signing in with your Pearson account. If you don't yet have a Pearson account, select Request access.

Once you've signed into your account and selected Accept and proceed, the resource file will download to your computer. The file is now downloaded and ready for you to use.

Some Pearson titles include testbanks which can upload to Learning Management Systems. Select the download link for the testbank compatible with your LMS. Have questions about uploading the testbank to your LMS? Talk to your LMS administrator or helpdesk if you have trouble uploading the file.
