Student can measure a length using non-standard units, but has difficulty estimating using non-standard units. "I can count the number of footsteps it takes to get to the Run and Scream stick, but I don't know how to estimate the distance."	4. Student consistently recognizes how First Nations, Métis, and Inuit use of the land can be used for estimation and measurement.
