Bacalah!



Emma is visiting Deni's house for the first time. What does he tell her about the house?

Hai, Deni.

Hai, Emma.

Wah, ada banyak sepatu di depan rumah kamu!

Silakan masuk. Ini ruang tamu.

Wah, rumahmu besar sekali!

Ah, tidak begitu besar. Ada empat kamar tidur di tingkat atas.
Di tingkat bawah juga ada kamar tidur untuk Bu Suti.

Siapa Bu Suti?

Dia pembantu kami.

Di Australia tidak ada pembantu tetapi ada *cleaner*—orang yang membersihkan rumah. Paman dan bibi saya di Australia punya *cleaner*.

Ya, Bu Suti memasak di dapur. Dia pandai memasak ... Ini dapur.

Dapur kamu modern.

Ya! Dapurnya direnovasi. Ayo kita ke tingkat atas ... Ini kamar duduk.
Nenek dan kakek menonton televisi di sini. Dan ini WC dan kamar mandi.

Ada berapa kamar mandi?

Ada dua kamar mandi. Ada satu di tingkat atas. Kamar mandi kedua di tingkat bawah, dekat kamar pembantu. Juga ada dua WC jongkok—satu di kamar mandi Bu Siti dan satu dekat kamar tidur orang tua saya. Di samping rumah ada garasi dari tempat cuci. Di belakang rumah ada kebun kecil. Kakak perempuan saya membaca buku di kebun.

Mari makan!



Yogyakarta, Java




Lake Sentani, Papua



Saling silang

Bathrooms in Indonesia and Australia can be very different. In Indonesia, the traditional way to wash is to use a **gayung** (dipper) to draw water from the **bak mandi** (tub) and then tip the water over yourself. There is a drain in the floor to take the water away. Another difference is that the toilet in many homes is a **WC jongkok** (squat toilet) rather than the raised toilet that you sit on.

It is common for middle- and upper-class Indonesian families to have a **pembantu** who lives in the home with them. The servants do a variety of chores such as babysitting, gardening, shopping and cooking for the family.
